(Questions to get everyone to participate)

1. What encounter with a ferocious dog or other animal would you sooner forget? What happened?
2. What is the most isolated place you've ever been? Did you like being there or did you want to get back to civilization quickly?

(Questions based on the primary texts)

Read Psalm 22:1-18.

1. From the passage, what do you diagnose as David's basic problem? Have you ever felt the same way?
2. Based on :3-5, what does David say about what God has been to Israel in the past?
3. Why did people mock David and how did their insults make him feel? (:6-7) Can you relate?
4. What did David say God had been for him? (:9-10) Can you relate?
5. How did the writer feel under the attacks of his adversaries? (:14-15) Can you relate?
6. Why do you think Jesus quotes sections of this Psalm while on the cross one thousand years later?
7. Why do you think people often feel distant from God? If someone feels far from God, what should they do?
8. What are the benefits of remembering what God has done for us in the past?
9. How can you share with others what God has revealed about Himself to you?
